NOFA Schedule

- Renewal Project E2s are due January 3rd
- Peer Review Committee will meet to evaluate projects the week of January 6th
- The deadline for final submission of the NOFA is February 3rd

Project Tiering

- We need to place \$64,168 (5%) from the CoC budget into Tier 2
- Using HUD's policy priorities we will evaluate and rank each project in order to strategically decide how to place this \$64,168 in Tier 2
 - Funds placed in Tier 2 are more susceptible to being cut if HUD does not have sufficient funding for all projects.

HUD Program and Policy Priorities

- FY2013-FY2014 NOFA emphasizes ending Chronic Homelessness by 2015
 - CoC projects can lose points in NOFA if they are not increasing the number of beds designated and/or prioritized for CH
 - Maximum points for
 - CoCs that increase the total number of PSH beds dedicated to CH persons since the 2012
 CoC Application 3 Points
 - Prioritizing for CH in at least 85% of PSH units not designated for CH when these units are made available through turnover 2 points
- Being doubled up does not count as a period of homelessness to qualify a household as CH
 - This prevents many homeless families from meeting HUD's definition of CH and, therefore, makes PSH for families ineligible to meet HUD's policy priorities
- We have a few new projects for CH, including Somerville St. and TWH PSH projects



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Should we have agencies begin prioritizing for CH now?

- o How would this prioritizing policy affect agencies?
- o Many of FIT's PSH units are for families.
 - o If FIT began prioritizing for CH in these units, they would still have to continue serving families and would prioritize CH families for these units
 - o The last PIT count reported 84 CH individuals and 1 CH family
- o Following this meeting, everyone will go back to their respective agencies and determine how many units can reasonably be designate and/or prioritize for CH
 - o These units still must meet existing program criteria, e.g. families, veterans, etc.

Housing First

- o Housing First is another policy HUD is emphasizing, particularly for CH persons as well.
- o Rich reported that Helping Hands' Safe Haven has a rate of 75% for participants maintaining sobriety and housing
 - This is about 25% above the national average.
 - Adopting a Housing First policy would likely jeopardize the success of their sober residents
- o Harbor Homes' Somerville St. has several Housing First units
- o There is a distinction, Mary said, between Housing First and still having rules for tenancy
 - Having Housing First would hurt our program measures because there would likely be high turnover

Moving Forward with Ranking and Tiering

- SNHS' SSO project will not reapply for HUD funds this year as the NOFA priorities indicate that HUD does not want to fund SSO projects going forward
- Even if we place their (approx.) \$34,000 in Tier 2, we still must account for another (approx.) \$28,000
- o Peer Review Committee will meet soon, likely during the first week of January
- o Leadership will make Tiering decisions before Peer Review meets

HMIS

- o What is our current capacity for tracking lengths of recidivism and returns to homelessness
 - This is difficult without an open HMIS system
 - Our Coordinated Assessment system will help us do this too
- o Many emergency shelters in NH have an open system
- o MEH and New Horizons are not part of this system
 - Cathy said that MEH could likely move to an open system
